APPLICATION PROCEDURE

1) NOMINATION:

The partner university sends a list of nominations to erasmus@uab.cat.

Nominations **MUST** include the following information:

- Erasmus code of the sending institution,
- name of the student,
- ID or passport number
- student's e-mail address,
- intended studies / host faculty at the UAB
- exchange period (Autumn term, Spring term or full year).

Please note that the maximum number of students accepted is established in the agreement.

Nomination deadlines:

1st of June: for starting in September (Autumn term or full year)

1st of December: for starting in February (Spring term)

2) APPLICATION:

Students must register and complete an online application at <http://sia.uab.es/>

“Sign in and Application form INcoming Students”

Application deadlines:

1st of April - 15th of June: for starting in September (Autumn term or full year)

1st of October - 10th of December: for starting in February (Spring term)

*Students wishing to come to the Faculty of Medicine **MUST ALWAYS** apply within the first period.

Applications without the previous nomination from the home university will not be considered.

Once we have checked that the applications match the nomination data sent by our partner universities, students will receive an e-mail with a digitized copy of their Acceptance Letter and pre-arrival information.

3) REQUIRED DOCUMENTS:

Students must fill in the **Learning Agreement** and send it to the [Exchange Office](#) of the faculty/center to which they have been assigned to at the UAB.

*Students coming for an exchange at the **Faculty of Medicine** should send their Learning Agreements to intercanvis.medicina@uab.cat before the **30th of June** for pre-approval. Receipt of the Learning Agreement is essential in this case, otherwise UAB will not be able to confirm acceptance.

APPLICATIONS TO EINA SCHOOL AND MASSANA SCHOOL (Design Studies):

All students wishing to apply to **Eina School of Design and Art** or **Massana School of Art and Design** should complete an additional application. This application, as well as the required documents, should be sent directly to the School. UAB will not accept students until they have received pre-acceptance from the School.

COURSE INFORMATION

According to UAB Exchange policy, students must enrol at least the 50% of their credits at the Faculty to which they have been assigned to. The other 50% can be taken at the rest of the UAB faculties, provided the groups are still open when doing the enrolment.

LANGUAGES OF INSTRUCTION:

Lectures at the UAB are mainly taught either in Catalan or in Spanish. The usage of either language depends only on the lecturer who gives the course. There are some lessons offered in English as well.

There are also a few degrees fully taught in English, but the courses corresponding to these degrees have limited seats for exchange students.

Obviously there are other lectures taught in English for the degrees of English Studies and Translation and Interpreting, but again these courses are preferably offered to the exchange students of these specific degrees.

LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS:

To get access to the courses offered at the **Faculty of Economics and Business**, according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR), a minimum level of **B2** will be required for the language of instruction of the chosen courses, that is, English, Spanish or Catalan. No certificate will be required for that language in which no courses have been selected. Regarding courses taught in Catalan, a Spanish certificate will also be accepted due to the similarity between both languages.

The required level can be stated by three possible ways:

1. Official Certifications (MECR B2, TOEFL IBT 87, TOEIC 1095, IELTS 5.5, TELC B2, CET-4 (China) 425, PTE General/Academic Level 3/59, Cambridge English FCE, British Council Aptis B2, Trinity College ISE II, DELE (Spanish) B2, SIELE (Spanish) B2.
2. Certification issued by the Language Services at the home university stating that the student has a minimum level of B2 or equivalent according to the mentioned official certifications.
3. Certification issued by the home university that states the student is following studies taught entirely in the corresponding language or has passed 90 credits in that language, as a minimum.

CATALAN AND SPANISH LANGUAGE COURSES

UAB exchange students have the right to register to a free initial training in Catalan language and then to continue learning this language with a subsidized offer. You can also attend subsidized lessons of Spanish.
