WELCOME SESSION (administrative enrollment)	compulsory for foreign exchange students or Double Diploma (except for students in 5 <sup>th</sup> year and internships). Otherwise, students won't be immediately enrolled at INSA.  -For Autumn Semester: 1 <sup>st</sup> week of September  - For Spring Semester: 2 <sup>nd</sup> week of January

French Language Summer School	French Language Summer School: August 2017 (to be confirmed)
Health insurance requirements and costs	Do you required students to have a health insurance?  YES it's compulsory if you stay more than 3 months AND if you don't have the European card of health insurance. In this case, students must take the insurance during the Welcome Session. (215 € in 2016).  In addition, students must subscribe while being in their home country an International Medical Health Insurance translated into French or English. This insurance shall be valid:  1. until Ausgust 31 <sup>st</sup> if the student arrives in July or August OR  2. until the 1 <sup>st</sup> day of the month following his/her arrival (Ex: if he/she arrive on October 4 <sup>th</sup> , valid until November 1 <sup>st</sup> )
Accommodation	The International Office (DRI) of INSA Toulouse does not manage the booking the accommodation any longer: students shall find it and book it by themselves.  We provide information and a <u>list of accommodations</u> to help students.  Students can also contact the <u>Toul'box service</u> to help them find an accommodation ("All-in" Package – 200€ in 2016)

Proof of sufficient means	Amount of money required by French embassy : 600 €/month
