How to complete your application	It is extremely important that the form is filled using the exact same information in the ID document and provide a valid email. Consider that this email will be used to send the official communications and documents from UEM. Students from outside of European Union must always use the passport as identification document. No applications without previous official nomination will be accepted.	
Required documents to complete your application	<ul> <li>Photocopy of identity document</li> <li>Academic transcript of records</li> <li>Proof of language proficiency</li> </ul>	
Course choice	<ul> <li>Students will be required to submit their course choice in the online application with the following instructions: <ol> <li>Choose the School in which you have been accepted.</li> <li>Choose a set of 5 courses (or 30 ECTS) per semester that you wish to study at UEM. You can choose any course in your School. Courses that belong to your specific subject area will be prioritized.</li> <li>Choose a set of 5 alternative courses (or 30 ECTS) per semester that you wish to study at UEM in case any of the first choices is not available.</li> </ol> </li> <li>Help tools: All students must use the "Academic offer 2019/2020" excel document and the Timetable simulator tool to make sure that their course election is viable. The excel document will be available in this <u>Shared Folder link</u>. You can learn how to use the timetable simulator using this <u>Video tutorial link</u>. </li> <li>Course choices will be accepted based on the following conditions: <ol> <li>Availability of courses.</li> <li>Schedule (No time overlaps will be accepted).</li> <li>Students' academic background.</li> <li>Courses that belong to the students' specific subject area will be prioritized. </li> </ol></li></ul>

# Course changes

Course change requests will be acceptable depending on the program in which the student has been accepted.

Course change requests will be processed based on availability and academic criteria. After the enrollment modification period, no more changes will be accepted.
