**Course information:**

Programme structure	<p>EURECOM is an engineering school, it offers courses at Bachelor’s level (year 3) and MASTER’s level (year 4 and 5=).</p> <p>To help students select their courses, the curriculum is organized around 5 study tracks:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Data Science</li> <li>- Internet of Things</li> <li>- Intelligent Communication Systems</li> <li>- Embedded Systems</li> <li>- Digital Security</li> </ul> <p>Students are free to choose any courses they want in accordance with the regulations of their home university. Please be aware that courses available may be overlapping. The final schedule is usually known several days before the start of the academic year.</p>
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	The studies are divided into semesters with the possibility to study at EURECOM <b>for one to four semesters</b> depending on the agreement with the home university.
100% Courses in English	All the courses taught are open to exchange students (both Technical and Non-Technical courses). The language of instruction is English. There is no prerequisite in French language. Students can take French classes during their exchange period.
Course Structure	There are two type of courses: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- <b>Short Courses</b> (2.5 ECTS): <b>21 hours</b> per Semester (3 hours per week during the 7 first weeks or the 7 last weeks of the semester, 3 hours every 2 weeks).</li> <li>- <b>Long Courses</b> (5 ECTS): <b>42 hours</b> per Semester (3 hours every week of the semester)</li> </ul> <p>Each course lasts <b>3</b> hours per week, except Language Classes which last 2 hours per week. Each Semester is made of 14 weeks of taught courses.</p>

#### Learning agreement, grading system and transcript of record:

Learning agreement for student mobility	We will issue a signed Learning Agreement based on the study plan approved by the Exchange Coordinators. The Learning Agreement can be adjusted after the beginning of the semester and an updated version will be issued.
Transcript of records	We will issue an official Transcript of Records when all the courses have been reported. Transcript is sent directly to the student. It can be sent to the international office of Home University upon request.
Grading system	A set number of credits are granted for each type of course (classes, project or professional thesis). To receive credits, students need to take an examination and obtain at least 10/20. The grading scale for the courses is as follows: A+ = 18 - 20 OUTSTANDING A = 16 - <18 EXCELLENT B = 14 - <16 VERY GOOD C = 12 - <14 GOOD D = 11 - <12 SATISFACTORY E = 10 - <11 PASSABLE F = 0 - <10 NOT VALID

**Additional information:**

Visa	Non-EU students need a student resident permit to be allowed to stay on the French territory for the duration of their studies and need to apply for an extended-stay visas with residency permit with the nearest French consulate. Health Insurance	EU students are exempt from having to register with the French student health security scheme. They will remain affiliated to the health insurance scheme in their home country. However, they should bring along with them the <a href="#">European Health Insurance Card</a> . Non-EU Students are automatically insured upon arrival.
