- English Language Certificate (where applicable)

Language Requirements

Full year students from EU/EEA and Non-EU/EEA countries

- IELTS: 6.0 overall with a minimum of 5.5 in each element
- TOEFL iBT: 76 overall with a minimum of 17 listening & writing, 18 reading, 20 speaking

Term only students from EU/EEA and NON-EU/EEA countries

- We may be able to accept a letter or certificate confirming the student has reached the minimum B2 level from EU/EEA institutions.

Visa Information

Full Year students (over 6 months)

- Need to apply for Student Visa
- Visa fee from outside the UK can be found here
- Students may be able to work
- Student will be required to pay Healthcare surcharge
- Essex will provide student with CAS (Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies) in order to apply for Student Visa.

Term only students (under 6 months)

From EU/EEA

- Do not need to apply for a visa
- Student will be provided with a standard visitor letter by Essex Abroad to show at the UK border
- Students are NOT allowed to work
- Students are permitted to undertake volunteering (for a registered Charity organisation / no more than 30 days in total)
- Health surcharge not required if students are eligible under the government healthcare rules. If not eligible, any NHS treatment will be payable unless it's a free service
- Students must ensure they have adequate health cover before leaving their home country.

From Non-EU

- Students <u>MUST</u> check <u>here</u> if they need to apply for a <u>Standard Visitor Visa</u>. Not all Non-EU/EEA students will require a visa.
- Student will be provided with a standard visitor letter by Essex Abroad to show at the UK border
- Students are NOT allowed to work
- Students are permitted to undertake volunteering (for a registered Charity organisation / no more than 30 days in total)
- Health surcharge not required but the student will need to pay for any NHS care they
 get at the point they use it unless it's a <u>free service</u>.
- Students must ensure they have adequate health cover before leaving their home country.

Exam Period

(Autumn Students only)

Students may have in-person exams, online exams or a combination of both.

For modules with in-person exams, these will run from Monday 18 December to Thursday

21 December 2023 and will take place on campus.

For modules with online exams, these will run from Tuesday 2 January to Friday 12 January 2024 and can be taken from any location with an internet connection.

More information will be available to students in due course.

Departure Date

Saturday 16 December 2023 (Provisional date)

This will depend on whether students have in-person exams after the end of the term, in which case they will need to leave later. We strongly advise students not to book their

return flight until they are sure about when their exams will be taking place.

Accommodation

Types of University maintained accommodation

Students staying with us for a full academic year will be accommodated on campus so long as they apply for it before the relevant deadline.

We offer single study bedrooms with shared kitchen facilities and either shared or ensuites bathroom. If students are studying at Colchester they must only select accommodation at our Colchester campus, students wishing to study at Southend must only select accommodation at our Southend campus.

Due to limited availability, we cannot guarantee on-campus accommodation for students studying for one term unless we have an agreement in place with the partner university. Term only students may need to source their own accommodation, but we will provide

them with guidance on alternative options.

Holiday Arrangements Accommodation remains open during the Christmas and Easter holidays.

All students are required to vacate their rooms at the end of the Summer term.

Students are able to leave their accommodation early if their exams finish before the end of term but **they will be liable to pay their fees** until the end of their contract at the end of

the summer term.

Accommodation application deadline

Accommodation is arranged via Essex Abroad and students will be notified in August/September for October entry and in December for January entry.

Students are not permitted to apply for on-campus accommodation other than through

Essex Abroad.

Accommodation fee We offer a range of different types of accommodation, from shared facilities to ensuite

rooms. The costs of each type of accommodation varies.

Accommodation payment will be due within the first month of arrival/beginning of each

term. The Accommodation team will manage this.
