Academic documents required to be submitted

1. Transcript

All applicants must submit their most recent academic transcript as part of the application process. All transcripts submitted must be official and in English and include:

- Name of home institution/university
- Name of programme of study, course or major
- List of all completed modules (courses) to date
- GPA or equivalent

Please note: If original transcript is not in English, an official translation is required (stamped by an official translator).

2. English Language Requirements

All international applicants (EU NATIONALS INCLUDED) are required to provide evidence that they have meet one of our English Language requirements as indicated:

3. Passport

All applicants are required to send a copy of their valid passport. Passports will need to remain valid for the entirety of the programme stay plus 6 months

4. Portfolio

For students wishing to study within the Belfast School of Art or Architecture, an e-portfolio will be required clearly showing practical experience in the areas they wish to study in.
