

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ACCOMMODATION:

Rooms on the Brussels Humanities, Sciences & Engineering Campus at U-Residence have been reserved for exchange students. Other options off campus are also available. On average, you'd pay between €350-€500 a month for a basic (shared) room.

VISA/HEALTH INSURANCE:

3 elements play a role:

- How long you will stay in Belgium (more than/less than 90 days)
- Your nationality (EEA* or non-EEA)
- Purpose of your stay (e.g. study)

Obtaining a visa can take up to 90 days, so start the process well in advance. Visas must always be obtained in country of origin.

After arrival you will need to apply for a Belgian ID-card, which are always be obtained in Belgium.

Health insurance is mandatory - contact us on international.relations@vub.be for more info.

ORIENTATION DAYS:

The days leading up to the start of the academic year, we organise Orientation Days. We encourage you to attend events during these days, so you get acquainted with Brussels, the university, and various procedures to help you settle in and feel at home.

DEADLINES:

Autumn Semester or full year: - nomination: 1 May

- application: 1 June

Spring Semester:

- nomination: 1 October
- application: 1 November

Late and/or incomplete applications will not be considered

HOW TO APPLY:

1. Check if your home university/faculty has an agreement with VUB

2. The home university officially nominates students via email to exchange.incoming@vub.be

3. VUB sends nominated students a link to the online application form. This needs to be filled in with academic and personal details, and the Learning Agreement and required application documents need to be uploaded:

- transcript of records
- proof of language competency
- proof of health insurance (if relevant)
- copy ID-card/passport
- passport photo

4. Evaluation/Selection

Law & Criminology

In the study fields of law and criminology, **English taught courses** are only available during the **Fall semester** of the academic year. For this reason, non-Dutch speaking students can only be nominated for the Fall semester and no prolongations are possible for these students.

Pharmacy

Due to capacity issues, we would like to inform you of some changes that will be needed from our side for the nomination procedure for the pharmacy study field. As the number of **spots in our labs** for students to carry out their thesis work is **limited** and it varies from year to year, when receiving a nomination, we would like to keep it on hold until we can guarantee a spot. The faculty can commit to providing an answer within **2 months from the nomination** of the student. For this reason, we would advise to nominate the students for the Pharmacy study field as soon as possible.

Psychology

Due to practical reasons (e.g., certain courses have content that needs to be taught in Dutch or use course materials such as roleplaying exercises that are only available in Dutch), the study field of psychology has a list of courses in English and a list of so-called **reading courses** (study materials available in English but course itself is in Dutch). We recommend you to inform your incoming exchange students of this distinction so that they can keep it into account when drafting their Learning Agreement.

Incoming students can also follow **courses from the English Educational Sciences** program in our faculty.
