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Language of instruction – Are courses taught in English available?	The main language of instruction at the University of Tübingen is German. The University is, however, constantly increasing the number of courses taught in English: Please see our <u>list of English</u> taught classes (available ca 2 months before semester start) or contact the applicable <u>academic advisor</u> .
Language requirements	<ul> <li>We expect our partners to nominate students who are on a B 2 / with a completed B1 level of German (in case they would like to take German-taught classes at one of the faculties) or on a B 2 level / with a completed B1 level of English (in case they would like to take English-taught classes). The levels refer to the <u>Common European</u> <u>Framework of Reference</u> for Languages (CEFR). We do not require proof of language proficiency, <u>unless</u>: <ul> <li>Law studies (all levels), ethnology (B.A. level), Chemistry/ Biochemistry (B.Sc. level): a proof of German completed B1/ on B2 by <u>all</u> exchange students</li> <li>Biology (1-3<sup>rd</sup> year B.Sc. level) / Molecular Medicine/Pharmacy (B.Sc. level): a proof of German completed B1/on B2 for students <u>from overseas</u> (no language proof needed for Erasmus or CIVIS students)</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

Are there any special language courses for exchange students before or during the semester ?	Yes, more than 50 different courses per semester. You will find them on the website of the Division <u>German as a Foreign Language and</u> <u>Intercultural Programs</u> . Participants do not have to pay any fees, only course material, field trips etc. We offer free beginner's courses in German for exchange students (A1/A2 level), <b>but please be aware</b> <b>that spaces are limited and we cannot guarantee any spaces</b> . In addition to <u>pre-semester intensive languages courses</u> , students can <b>take up to three classes during the semester</b> with <u>German as a</u> <u>Foreign Language and Intercultural Programs</u> .

Restricted programs or courses (not open to all exchange students)	<ul> <li>Exchange students will be required to pay a non-waivable student services fee (currently around € 120 per semester) to the Studierendenwerk (governmental student service organization of German universities). The fee is mandatory for all students (also the German students) and subsidizes the semester bus ticket, meals at the cafeteria, as well as free psychological counselling.</li> <li>Human Medicine: not available for exchange students coming to Tübingen through a university-wide agreement</li> <li>Biology: available for students who are majoring in biology / a closely related study field</li> <li>Pharmacy: available for students who are majoring in pharmacy</li> <li>Faculty of Sciences (including Psychology): needs a Learning Agreement/study plan and a transcript for course approval</li> <li>Economics &amp; Business Administration: For Bachelor programs in English, overseas students need to have completed 2 math/ statistics/econometrics and 2 business/economics courses (e.g., microeconomics). Does not apply for Erasmus &amp; CIVIS students.</li> </ul>

	<ol> <li>Advisory Course ICE: General orientation program for new international and exchange students in the week before the lecture period starts: 5€</li> </ol>	
	<ol> <li><u>StudIT Intro-Week</u>: General orientation program for new exchange students in the first week of the lecture period.</li> </ol>	
	<ol> <li>Start Course: 3-week language course before the semester with an orientation part designed for exchange students with intermediate to good knowledge of German: 150€</li> </ol>	
	<ol> <li><u>Deutsch-Kompakt Course</u>: Intensive 5-week language course before the semester designed to prepare exchange students for their study-abroad experience in Tübingen. The course includes cultural events and excursions: 855€</li> </ol>	

Arrival /	'Orientation	Program
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Accommodation	
Is university-administered accommodation available to exchange students?	The student dormitories are not administered by the University, but by the so-called " <u>Studierendenwerk</u> ", the Student Service Organization, which is not affiliated with the University. However, the University of Tübingen has a yearly quota of rooms that are reserved solely for exchange students. Basic info: <u>Accomodation</u> . Please see for details of the dormitories the <u>Overview of residence</u> <u>halls</u> by the Studierendenwerk.
	All rooms for exchange students are fully furnished single rooms with shared kitchen and usually shared bathrooms. We strongly recommend students to opt for student housing because of the difficult and expensive private housing market in Tübingen.
Where do students send their accommodation application?	Students can apply for housing online directly on the <u>Website of the</u> <u>Studierendenwerk</u> . Contracts will be available for the duration of the whole semester only. There is a deposit of 600€ due upon arrival.
Is accommodation available over semester breaks?	Yes. Students can stay in their rooms until the end of the contract. Dorms are open year-round, students do <u>not</u> have to move out during breaks.

Visa Requirements

Are exchange students required to obtain a student visa?	<ul> <li>Citizens of the following countries are allowed to enter Germany without a visa but need to apply for a student residence permit within 90 days after they enter Germany: Andorra, Australia, Brazil, El Salvador, Honduras, Israel, Japan, Canada, Monaco, New Zealand, San Marino, South Korea, United Kingdom and the United States of America. These students can apply for the residence permit directly at the Foreigners' Office in in Tübingen after having arrived in Germany.</li> <li>Students from none of the above-mentioned countries should please contact us or the embassy if you are uncertain whether you need a visa prior to entering Germany.</li> <li>EU students and from Switzerland do not need visas, but will only register their residency once they are in Tübingen.</li> </ul>	
Are exchange students allowed to work?	On campus: Yes – more than the hours mentioned below (but students should ask for further information!) Off campus: Yes – 120 days per year when working 8 hours a day or 240 days per year when working 4 hours a day.	
Is a special visa required for work?	The above-mentioned 120 days need to be marked in the student visa. Students have to inform the "Ausländerbehörde" about their work.

	any German insurance company (ca 120€ / month), or as students in
	the European Union, they can take their EHIC-card to a "statutory
	health insurcane company". It will check if the insurance meets the
	minimum requirements. If yes, it can confirm to the university that the
	student's insurance policy is sufficient.
