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ACADEMIC WORKLOAD

1 ECTS worth 25 hours of work at ESA.

Exchange students can take a workload of up to five modules (30 ECTS) per semester (including a French language course if selected).

To pass one module, students must obtain a mark 10/20 minimum.

LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

- B2 in English or equivalent (Certificate from home institution is accepted)
- Students only need to provide proof of a B2 French proficiency level if they want to enrol in French-taught modules.

PRACTICAL INFORMATION

VISA*

*Compulsory for non-EU students

Dependent on requirements from French embassy of the student's home country. Students need to contact the Campus France office located in their home country. Student must obtain the visa for the orientation days before the start of the semester. Upon arrival, students need then to validate the visa. Useful resources can be found on Campus France Website.

INSURANCE*

*Compulsory for non-EU students

Non-EU students must obtain a travel medical insurance (including repatriation) which covers the whole period of study. Please, refer to the insurance requirements stated to obtain your visa. EU students must obtain the European Health Insurance card in their home country before arrival.

HOUSING

Housing options are sent to students before their arrival by the Incoming coordinator. Several types of accommodation are available: host families, student residences and flat renting.

WELCOME DAYS

Welcome days and French language classes are offered to international students upon arrival. Depending on the study program students are enrolled in, they must take intensive French language classes.
