To achieve this goal, its research priorities focus on digital transformation, medicine and health, as well as sustainable and societal development. The University invests in its knowledge and technology transfer through an attractive intellectual property policy and numerous partnerships.

8,000 students are enrolled at Uni.lu, of which 1,100 are doctoral candidates. With 300 professors, students have privileged access to world-renowned expertise.

Times Higher Education ranks Uni.lu 20th in the Young University Ranking 2024 and among the top 250 universities in the world.

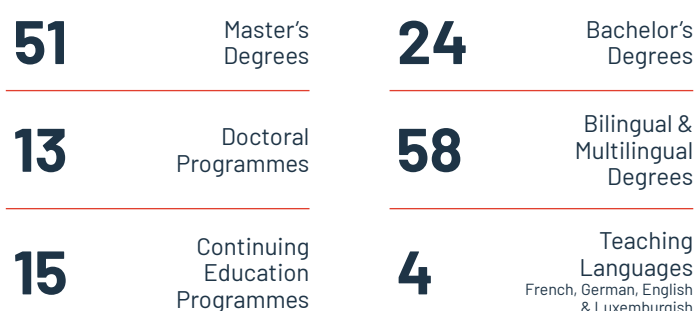

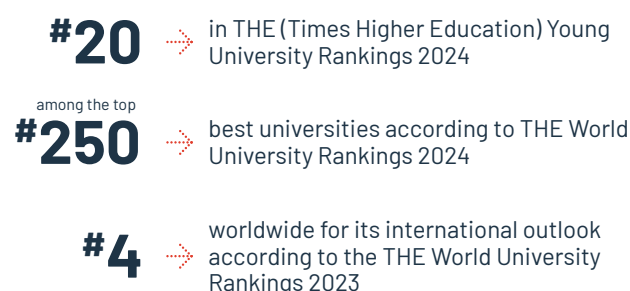
